Role context

The vision for St Peter's Brighton is the (re)evangelisation of the nations and the transformation of society and the revitalisation of the Church. Each member of staff plays a key role in contributing to our vision. Our mission is bigger than any individual task but together our work contributes to the bigger picture. As a Christian organisation our faith is an integral part of our working culture.

We are looking for a highly motivated and passionate individual, eager to work in a dynamic environment with a strong can-do attitude to join our team as Production Technician.

Role purpose

The Production Technician will be responsible for overseeing the technical production for services and events requiring support with audio, video, streaming & lighting needs - a background of live sound engineering is preferred. There will be a key focus on raising volunteers to carry out much of the day-to-day duties and more as we seek to support the wide and varied offering that the church needs. The role requires technical understanding and practical experience operating event production systems, with experience in A/V of both large seasonal events and live services. For events, the goal is to provide a seamless experience to all involved (ministry heads, guests, and volunteers), as well as to establish an efficient and reliable technical environment. In this role you'll work with internal teams and volunteers on a daily and weekly basis.

Key responsibilities

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Deliver technical production support for all Sunday services and events at St Peter's through the Reach Recruit Raise and Release Model of Volunteer Team.
- Work within the technical production team and lead the volunteer team at St Peter's including recruitment, building and training the team.
- Coordinate a team of volunteer technicians and allocate tasks effectively for the successful completion of an event.
- Carry out roles as required for services and events across the church, with a particular focus on operation of Sound, Video and Lighting systems throughout the venue.



- Provide technical solutions and support to the wider team and assist in the hands-on delivery of services/events.
- Where required operate event production equipment including but not limited to audio desk, lighting desk, vision mixer and cameras / operation.
- Oversee the day-to-day housekeeping and maintenance of a hi-tech worship venue.
- Work with leadership and teams who might not be technically minded in pre-production to explain the capabilities of the space and go over best practice to ensure the event is a success.
- Work with event production team to provide feedback on possible enhancements and improvements.
- Participate in creative team brainstorming sessions.
- Identify new and alternative ways of approaching technical production offering.
- Comply and enforce all building and industry Health & Safety procedures
